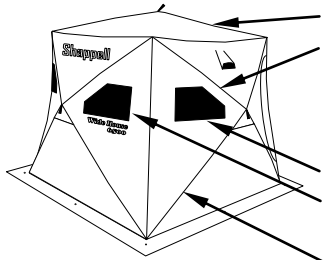

### WINDOWS ARE NOT GUARANTEED AT TEMPERATURES BELOW -15 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT.

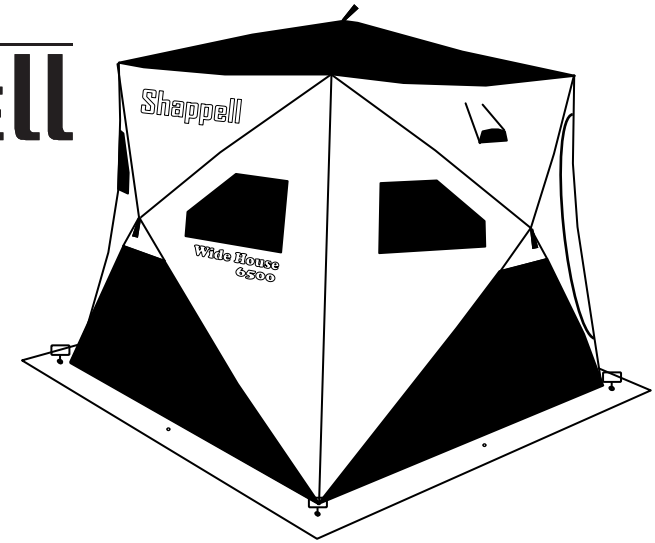

### IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION



**WARNING: KEEP ALL FLAME AND HEAT SOURCES AWAY FROM THIS TENT FABRIC.** This tent meets the flammability requirements of CPAI-84. The fabric may burn if left in continuous contact with any flame source. The application of any foreign substance to the tent fabric may render the flame resistant properties ineffective.



**CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING HAZARD:** This shelter must be ventilated if using an oxygen consuming heat source. **DO NOT PACK SNOW AROUND SHELTER** or in any way prevent fresh air from entering shelter. **Failure to ventilate shelter could create a serious health hazard or death.**

Windows cannot be made to withstand temperatures below -15° F. (see warranty)

**MAINTENANCE:** After each use, set up shelter until fabric is completely dry. **Never leave shelter folded/closed with a wet cover.**

**NOTICE:** It is normal for fabric to have some pinholes. This does not affect water repellency.

## Set Up

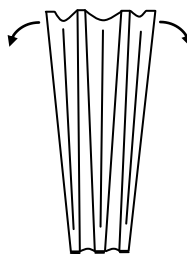

1) Remove tent from bag and set hub end on ice. (Fig. 1)

2) Unfold tent and screw in ice anchor at one corner eyelet. (Fig. 2)

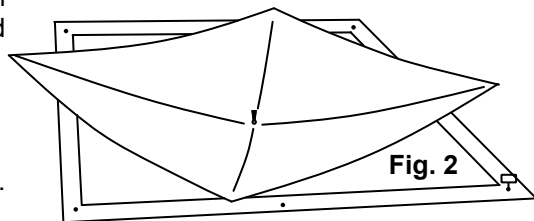

3) Pull up on top hub or pull out side hub, whatever is easiest. (Fig. 3)

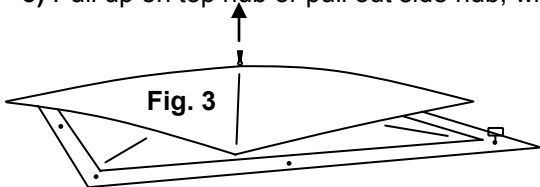

4) Pull out side hub while pushing against top center. (Fig. 4)

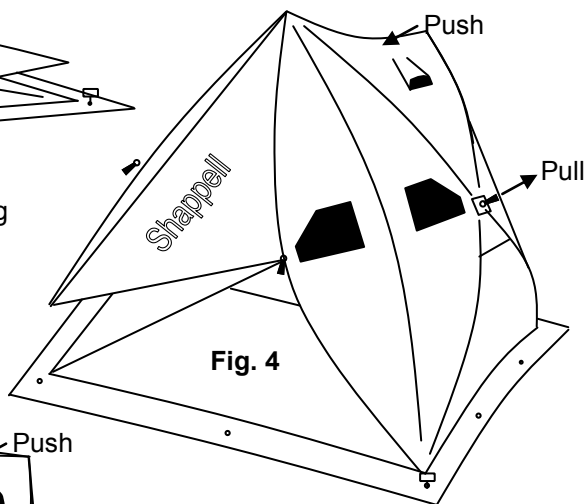

5) Pull out all remaining hubs. (Fig. 5)

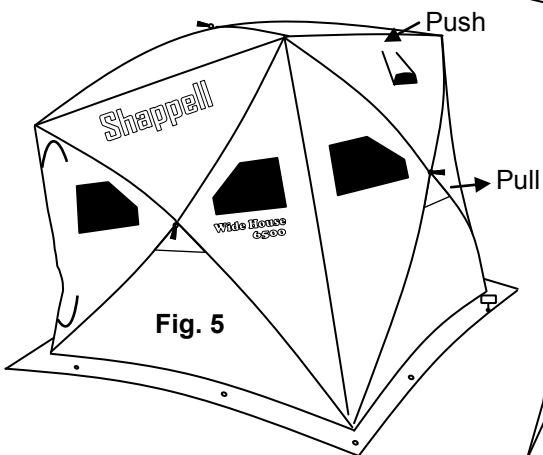

6) Install remaining ice anchors as needed. (Fig. 6)

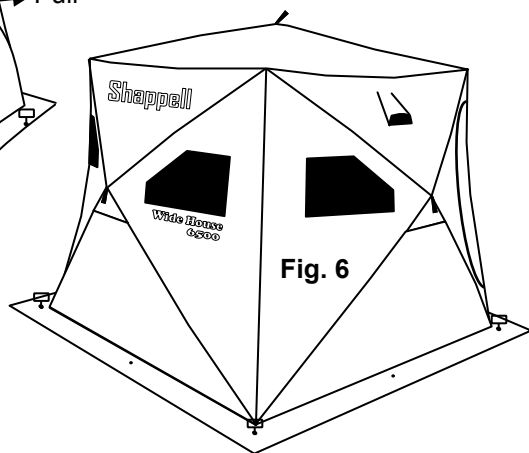

## Take Down

1) Remove ice anchors, leaving one. Push in on side hub so it pops in. (Fig. 7)

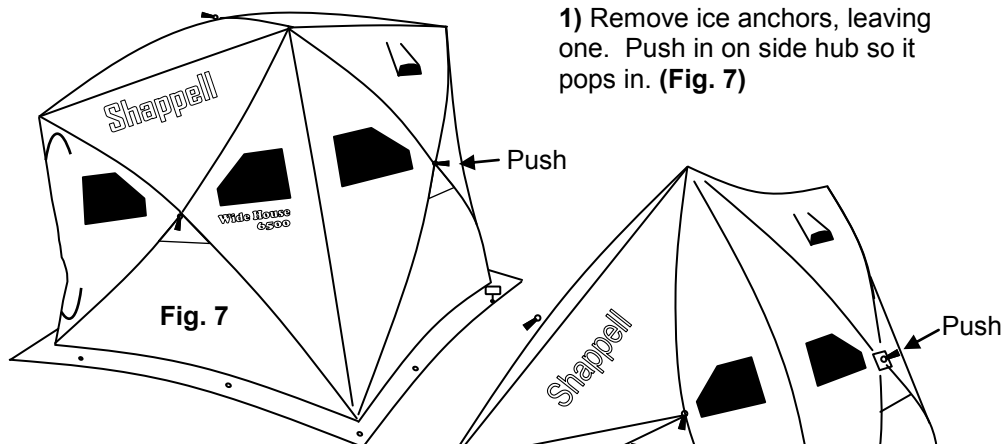

2) Push remaining side hubs in. (Fig. 8)

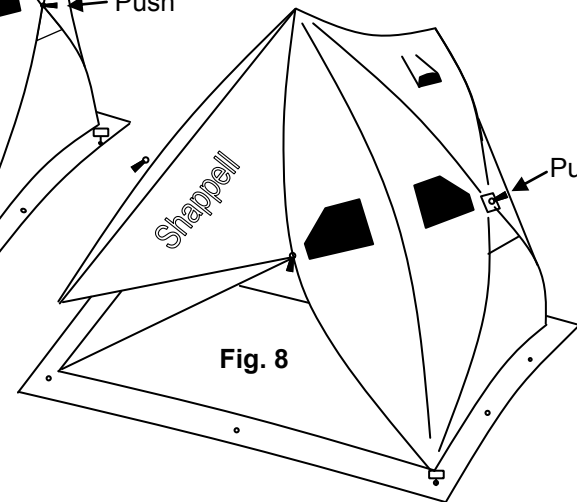

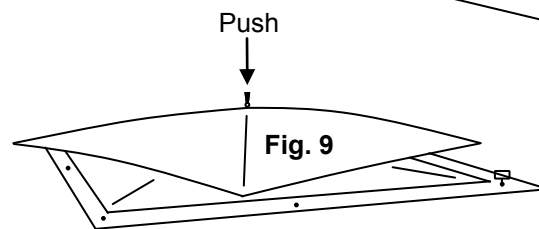

3) Push top hub down. (Fig. 9)

4) Remove last ice anchor and fold all corners up. (Fig. 10) & (Fig. 11)

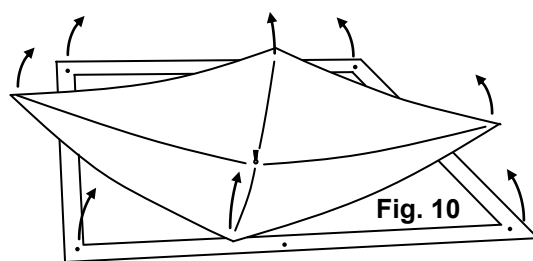

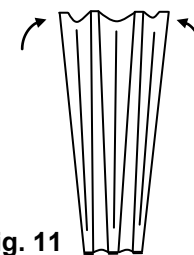

5) Put tent into bag with hubs at the bottom of bag. (Fig. 12)

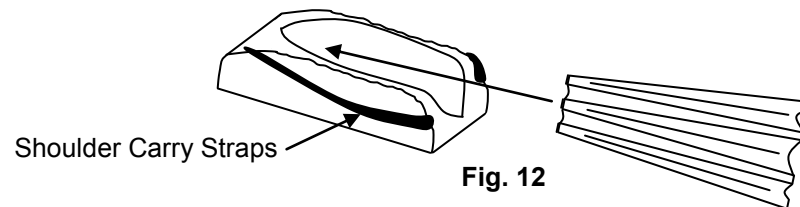
